Bill is a native of Austin, Texas. He attended Colby College in Waterville, Maine, where he played Division III basketball and earned a degree in Psychology. After graduation, Bill took a job as the Program Director at Camp La Junta for Boys, which he attended as a child, and has been a full-time Camp Director since 1999. He started his YMCA career as the Outdoor School Director at Camp Classen, the Overnight Camp at the YMCA of Greater Oklahoma City. He then spent ten years as the Executive Director of Camp Flaming Arrow at the YMCA of Greater San Antonio and was instrumental in reaching 92% occupancy and balancing the budget. In 2014, he became the Executive Director of Camp Manitou-Lin at the YMCA of Greater Grand Rapids. During quarantine, he served as the VP of Camping Services for the YMCA of Northern Colorado, bringing Camp Santa Maria back up to speed post-COVID. He later moved back to Michigan as the Camp Director of YMCA Camp Hayo-Went-Ha, where he learned the

ins and outs of Independent YMCA Camping. He took the reins of the South Mountain YMCA Camps this April saying, "From day one I have felt welcome on Mountain.". He has been impressed with Camp's staff and operations and looks forward to taking camp to the next level and Keeping the Fires Burning. Bill has a keen eye and a focus on strong financial stewardship as well as mission development and fundraising. He also has a passion for creating a culture of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion.

At Bynden Wood Day Camp, we continue to pride ourselves on the rewarding task of providing our local families with more than just a place to go










during the summer months we believe attending Bynden Wood Day Camp is an opportunity for our campers to make memories, grow in independence, and learn values such as caring, honesty, inclusion, respect, responsibility that contribute to a strong community at camp as well as back at home. Our wide range of activities, including climbing, swimming, crafts, sports, and nature exploration, is designed to ignite our campers' curiosity and foster a love of adventure. A bit of variety was added to our weekly routine by inviting community partners, such as Hawk Mountain Sanctuary and Berks County Search & Rescue. Our highly trained staff from around the world serve as passionate mentors to our campers, creating a safe, inclusive, and supportive environment where they can learn, grow, and thrive. We heavily invest in their training and development to provide the best possible experience for our campers. We also continue to organize themed weeks to keep the experience fresh and exciting for campers. While Session Ten's "Color Wars" theme again reigned supreme by drawing in 169 campers, "Star Wars",
"Stone Age", "Holidaze", and
"Spy vs. Spy" were other popular themes. This year, Bynden Wood Day Camp finally returned to pre-pandemic numbers and operated at near-capacity, hosting 463 individual campers from 289 households for a total of 1,358 camper weeks. That's an average of 136 campers per week for the ten weeks of summer!

2023 Camp Conrad Weiser Season in Review

BRINGING PEOPLE TOGETHER, BUILDING SKILLS, AND REDISCOVERING LIFE WITHOUT TECHNOLOGY

This year has been a testament to our unwavering commitment to providing a transformative experience for our campers, filled with opportunities for personal growth, building social and life skills, character development, and the joys of life without technology. In 2023, Camp Conrad Weiser hosted a total of 681 campers who stayed with us for a total of 1,178 weeks, a significant increase over 2021. An impressive 71% of all eligible campers from 2022 returned to camp this year. Both statistics reflect the strong demand for our unique camp experience and the enduring appeal and value of Camp Conrad Weiser in the lives of our campers and their families. We also continued to strengthen our international ties by hosting delegates from the YMCAs of Germany and Spain. They participated in traditional camp weeks, leadership programs, homestays, and exciting sightseeing trips to nearby cities. Additionally, we sent a delegation of ICEP campers to Germany, accompanied by our dedicated Leader, Kevin Hernandez. Six campers from our community had the extraordinary opportunity to attend the first-ever Global Leaders Camp in Salduero, Spain, hosted by our partners at the YMCA of Spain, with Patrick Newill serving as the leader. We hosted three Counselor-In-Training Sessions throughout the summer, empowering future leaders and providing them with valuable skills. Two Equestrian Specialty Camps provided campers with unique horseback riding experiences, while our Literary-themed Camps — Camp Half-Blood and Penn's Woods — ignited imaginations and encouraged a love for reading and storytelling. The Summer ended with our teen travel program, "Adventure-Palooza" which took 16 teens around the state for spelunking, whitewater rafting, biking, ziplining, train rides, amusement park adventures, and more! We proudly welcomed 122 (not all international) staff members from 10 different countries, enriching the camp experience with diverse perspectives and cultural exchange.

In closing, we are immensely proud of the resilience and dedication displayed by our camp community throughout the challenges of the past few years. Camp Conrad Weiser remains a place where young people can come together, grow, and discover the beauty of life without constant technology. We look forward to another year of fostering personal growth, creating lifelong memories, and strengthening the bonds that make Camp Conrad Weiser so special.




