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
The View From the Peak

Alumni Spotlight

A.S. King: From Camp to Award-Winning Author & Advocate

Many alumni remember Amy Sariq—now A.S. King—as a craft shop counselor and Pioneer Village Chief in 1987 and 1988. Today, she is a celebrated Young Adult author known for her unique storytelling and thought-provoking themes.

King has written over a dozen books, including Please Ignore Vera Dietz, Ask the Passengers, and The Dust of 100 Dogs. She is the only author to win the Michael L. Printz Award twice—for Dig (2020) and The Collectors: Stories (2024). Her accolades also include the Los Angeles Times Book Prize and the Margaret A. Edwards Award for her lasting contribution to YA literature.

Beyond writing, Amy is a dedicated advocate for LGBTQ+ youth. Along with her son, Jaxon, she is the Founder and Vice President of Gracie's House, which helps create safe spaces for LGBTQ+ youth in rural areas. Through Gracie's House, she runs PRIDE Camp and FOUND Family Weekend Camps, both hosted at Camp Conrad Weiser, providing affirming experiences for LGBTQ+ youth and their families. The organization also supports arts and music workshops to uplift LGBTQ+ voices.

Her journey from camp counselor to award-winning author and advocate highlights the creativity, leadership, and compassion nurtured at South Mountain YMCA Camps. We are proud to count her among our alumni!

A New Era for Our Dining Hall

We are very excited to announce the completion of the long-awaited project to enhance our historic Dining Hall! Since 1948, we've had only two restrooms, making it challenging for campers to access facilities — especially in bad weather. With this new 2,800-square-foot expansion, we're increasing restroom availability (to 14!) and introducing a nurse's station for easier medication dispensing. The addition also includes a new wood-paneled watch office, allowing senior staff to continue to improve their programs while maintaining full view of all activities on the A-field. The addition blends seamlessly with the existing structure, maintaining our camp's charm while offering modern amenities like climate-control and two water bottle filling stations. Further enhancing the experience for all are a fully accessible entrance and various configurations to better meet diverse needs and ensure a more inclusive environment.

The project was funded through The American Rescue Plan, a generous gift from the Berks County Commissioners, The Y-USA Strategic Initiatives Fund, and local community and alumni donors. A huge "thank you" goes out to everyone who contributed, as well as to our Facilities Director, Brandon Tanner, and his entire team for their incredible handiwork!

The grand re-opening dedication will be held on Friday, June 13 from 5-8pm. Join us for a fun-filled alumni gathering featuring Bills Burgers and an evening around the campfire! It's the perfect chance to reconnect with old friends, meet this summer's staff, and enjoy a classic camp tradition!
